This addendum is issued prior to the receipt of proposals and award of contract, in order to provide changes and or clarifications in the proposal requirements issued by the County of Monroe, Michigan. This addendum will become part of the Request for Proposal and any contractual obligations shall be met by the respective parties to the ensuing contract.

Please amend the Request for Proposal dated September 28, 2020 by including in the RFP the following information and changes:

1. Pages 1, 3, 5 and 6-Proposal Deadline

Page 6 listed an incorrect time for receipt of proposals. All pages of the RFP documents should note the proposals are due no later than **Friday, October 16, 2020 at 5:00 p.m.**

2. Page 2

1). Terrain. To clarify, the County is asking for the engineer to provide as part of the analysis/feasibility, computer generated propagation maps between the two options of VHF and 800 MHz frequency bands in order to identify potential problematic areas and how deficiencies, if any, would be overcome. Supplementing task may include the engineer's recommendation to also perform RSSI coverage testing. Your proposal shall provide the cost of both and separated for the County to consider one or the other or conducting both types of testing as the basis for making an informed decision.

3. Page 2

4). Licenses. To clarify, the County wants to be assured the current VHF license, if continuing with VHF as the best solution for Monroe County, is the optimal frequency to operate on or should other available frequencies with corresponding licenses be secured that would allow for higher ERP that would improve communication performance.

4). Licenses. To clarify, the matter of interference has been a challenge for the County in prior frequency coordination and licensing. What the County is looking for is an assurance from the engineer, that the matter of interference and coordination is thoroughly addressed and any recommendation has considered the obstacles that may be present when the County moves to implement the recommendation action. A complete

understanding of the history and underlying reasons for the County's current operating licenses, equipment and infrastructure is inherent in providing a sound and practical recommendation.
