

## **NOTICE TO BIDDERS**

Kershaw County will receive sealed Bids for the **Voter Registration Road/Parking Lot Project**, BID # 21-132-01, until 2:00 P.M., Thursday, July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at the Kershaw County Government Center, Sarah Williams, Room 208, 515 Walnut Street, Camden, South Carolina 29020. Kershaw County is not responsible for delays in the mail. Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. Bids received after the stated time will not be accepted. A Bid Bond shall be required in the amount of 5% of bidder's maximum bid price.

### **SCOPE OF WORK:**

This project will consist of the removal of existing parking lot asphalt, grading, drainage, partial wall removal, and reconstruction of approximately 152 LF of roadway to the new Voter Registration Building and the partial asphalt removal, grading and striping of the existing parking lot to meet ADA requirements, located in Camden, South Carolina. See title sheet for exact project location, roadway is part of the existing courthouse parking lot directly behind 1113 Broad Street.

### **CONTRACT TIME:**

The total contract time shall be 60 consecutive calendar days from the date of Notice-to-Proceed.

### **BIDDING DOCUMENTS:**

Bidders must purchase plans from Michael Baker International and that payment must have been received to be eligible to bid on the project.
