City of Morro Bay Notice Requesting Proposals/Qualifications and Contract for Engineering Design Services: City Park Transit Hub Improvements

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN the City of Morro Bay (the "City"), located in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, is requesting proposals from firms desiring to perform consulting engineering services necessary for the City Park Transit Hub Improvements.

The City of Morro Bay Public Works Department of must receive all proposals by **2:00 p.m. on Thursday, August 19, 2021.**

The City will not consider proposals received after that date and time. Submit proposals to the City of Morro Bay Public Works Department in a sealed envelope plainly marked with the proposal title, consultant name and address, and time and date of the proposal submittal deadline.

Proposals shall be mailed to: City of Morro Bay, Public Works Department, 595 Harbor Street, Morro Bay, 93442; or hand delivered to the Department at 955 Shasta Ave, Morro Bay, 93442.

General Work Description:

The City of Morro Bay is seeking proposals from qualified Civil Engineering design firms for the design of improvements to the City Park Transit Hub.

The public transit service is an important element of Morro Bay's mobility network. The community is served by the Morro Bay Transit (MBT) program (including both fixed route/call-a-ride and rubber-tired trolley services), the local School, as well as the San Luis Obispo, south to Los Osos and north to San Simeon. The key connection point for these services is currently a bus shelter in the northwest corner of the City Park, where transfers are provided between the various routes.

As part of the first phase of the project, the City developed a "Morro Bay Transit Hub Study" to review existing conditions, transit services and evaluate potential site locations. The study produced recommendations for a project program, conceptual plans and a related list of improvements. The City Council identified the existing location to be best suited for the study's recommended improvements.

Using the recommended project program and conceptual plan from the "Morro Bay Transit Hub Study", the City will require the Civil Engineering design firm (Consultant) to create construction plans, specifications and a cost estimate, in order to produce a "ready to list" bid package for the final project installation.

The selection of consultant will be based on qualification and expertise of the proposed personnel and firm, in that order. Once a fee is negotiated with the selected Consultant, based on a mutually agreed upon Scope of Work, the scope and fee will be submitted to the City Manager for approval.
